RESPONSIBILITIES:	<p>The School of Nursing and Health Studies, in the College of Health and Human Sciences at Northern Illinois University, invites applications for a Director of the Undergraduate Nursing Program. This is a tenure-line faculty position at the rank of associate or full professor, to begin August 2015.</p> <p>The Director of the Undergraduate Nursing Program is an academic and administrative officer for the School and is accountable directly to the Chair of the School. The responsibilities of the Director of the Undergraduate Nursing Program include, but are not limited to, assisting the Chair in the general administration of the undergraduate nursing program, serving as an <i>ex officio</i> designee on selected committees, assisting in the functions of the School as an instructional, research and public service unit, and contributing to the School's mission.</p> <p>The nursing programs include a B.S. in Nursing through pre-licensure and degree-completion programs, and an M.S. in Nursing with specializations in Family Nurse Practitioner, Adult-Gerontology Nurse Practitioner, Adult-Gerontology Clinical Nurse Specialist, and Nurse Educator. The program is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education.</p>
MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:	<p>The successful candidate must have 1) have an earned doctorate in nursing or a related field; (2) be eligible for tenure at the rank of professor or associate professor in the School; (4) have a master's degree in nursing; (5) be eligible for licensure as a Registered Nurse in the State of Illinois; (6) have administrative experience or the potential to develop administrative skills, including the knowledge of the structure, policies, and procedures of research intensive educational institutions; (7) have teaching experience in a baccalaureate or advanced degree program; and (8) have evidence of positive interactions with colleagues, students, and the community.</p>
PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:	<p>Those candidates who (1) have an established program of scholarship that includes familiarity with the external funding process; (2) have experience developing and evaluating academic programs; (3) have a history of participation in professional organizations; and (4) are qualified to be a member of the graduate faculty will be given preference.</p>
