MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:	 The successful candidate will: Have a PhD in nursing science or a closely related area (applicants who are ABD will be considered if their dissertation will be complete by August 15, 2017), Have a master's degree or higher with a major in nursing, Be eligible for licensure as a Registered Nurse in Illinois
PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:	Those candidates who are an Advance Practice Registered Nurse (APRN), have successful university-level teaching experience, a proven ability to conduct research and secure external funding will be given preference.
