(QSEN.org; Cronenwett et al., 2009)-Plans, supervises and evaluates student clinical learning.-Collaborates with classroom instructional faculty in the planning and implementation of clinical learning experiences.-Respects and communicates the dignity, worth, and culture of students, faculty, colleagues, peers, staff, patients, families, and communities.-Maintains ethical standards of the profession of nursing and the University.-Adheres to state and federal laws (i.e., privacy, confidentiality, and reporting of student and patient information).

- Communicates effectively with students and colleagues.
- Prepares in advance for clinical content.
- Assists students in learning skills; assists students with transfer, utilization, and synthesis of previous knowledge.
- Provides physical and emotional environment conducive to effective teaching and learning.
- Maintains satisfactory agency-University relationship.
- Evaluates appropriateness of clinical agencies used for teaching.
- Demonstrates ability to teach effectively.
- Demonstrates enthusiasm for teaching and nursing.
- Evaluates data from students and colleagues regarding own strengths and weaknesses for improvement of teaching. Seeks consultation as needed.
- Facilitates students' entry into professional role (i.e., encourages students to read professional journals and attend conferences).
- Participates in simulation and laboratory based learning experiences.

- Disseminates research/scholarship to students through teaching.
- Participates in projects to improve health care.

Service:

- Actively serves as a member of MNSON committees and/or task forces.
- Participates in University and MNSON activities.

Evidence of continuing development of Teaching, Scholarly and Creative Endeavors, and Service is required.</p>
