A doctorate (PhD, DNP, or other professional doctorate) is required for the Assistant Professor rank.</p> <p>Post-secondary teaching experience commensurate with appointment at the rank of non-tenure track Instructor or higher and commitment to research and scholarly endeavors, consistent with the rank. Content expertise nursing leadership and management is required. Prior experience in a leadership or management position in healthcare is highly desirable, as is prior teaching experience in leadership and management, and experience with simulation based learning.</p>
