The improvement grants (approximately \$40,000 each) are still available; application deadline October 31, 2014. IBHE Nursing Faculty Fellowship grants: a. These annual grants are a salary supplement, benefits are deducted; each school is limited to nominate 3 candidates annually; one can reapply 5 years after grant receipt. b. Funding has been maintained or increased since awards began in 2007, 15 awards in FY2007 and 22 awards in FY2014. Each award is \$10,000, except for one year the individual award was \$9,061. c. The percentage of Fellows by sector, private not-for-profits have a slightly larger percentage of the total number of fellows than the public sector. For the first time in 2014 the number of nominations and fellows in community colleges went down. - 1. ICN Strategic Planning Partnership Conference: I again thank our manager, Linda B. Roberts and the ICN Strategic Planning committee of Maureen Shekleton, chair, Donna Meyer, Melinda Noonan, and Michele Bromberg for the exceptional conference on Monday, September 29, 2014. This first step toward developing partnerships for building the requisite nursing workforce for Illinois citizens now challenges the ICN Advisory Board to identify next steps toward meeting our central challenge. I have asked M. Shekleton to lead a de-briefing discussion at the October ICN Board of Directors meeting, so all members may provide insights and reflections for the committee's next meetings. For those not in attendance at the October 8, 2014 ICN Board meeting, I ask you to send comments to M. Shekleton.
- 2. Operational Procedures: Marsha Prater, Donna Meyer, and I are serving as an ad hoc committee to propose operational procedures for ICN prior to the December 2014 meeting. This includes rules for elections and other processes for regular reporting from our partners, such as the Board of Nursing. At the October 2014 ICN Board meeting, I invite discussion on methods to ensure geographical and expert diversity on the board. As you know, Board members are appointed by either the Governor or the Secretary of the Department in accordance with statutory requirements (IDFPR website resource: http://www.idfpr.com/BoardsCommittees.asp). The Division of Professional Regulation welcomes input from the Board on areas of needed expertise and also guidance with maintaining diversity. As you know, ICN's needed expertise will vary with changes in health care and health care delivery.

For example: Please consider the following as an introduction for our discussion:

When vacancies occur on the Illinois Center for Nursing Advisory Board due to expired terms, resignations, or removal, the Board will propose suggestions for selection of the replacement member in compliance with statute (NPA Article 75: ICN, Section 17-15, see attached). This will include consideration of geographical diversity as well as specialty expertise, per statutory mandate. These criteria, with rationale, will be forwarded to the Director of IDPR for consideration with the next recommendation for appointments.

3. Election: At the October meeting, we will elect the new chair and vice-chair. The nominees are Maureen Shekleton, chair and Donna Meyer for vice-chair. As I chair my last meeting, I thank each of you for your support, dedication and contribution to a year of strategic planning and implementation. It has been a pleasure to work with each of you. Thank you for your service and your commitment to improving the nursing workforce in Illinois.

Re: Partnership Workgroup Report

The stakeholder meeting was held on Monday, September 29, 2014 at the State of Illinois Bilandic Center. The registration for this invitational conference was closed at capacity. Actual attendance was 64 participants in addition to 8 Illinois Center for Nursing (ICN) Board Of Directors members, 4 Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation (IDFPR) staff, 11 panelists, 1 keynote speaker, the chair of the Illinois Healthcare Action Coalition (IHAC) Collaboration Workgroup, and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) diversity consultant. As intended, participants represented a wide array of diverse stakeholder groups including education, hospital based care, community based care, public health, consumers, policy groups, health professional organizations, insurance, business and unions representing healthcare workers. IDFPR Division of Professional Regulation Director Jay Stewart and IDFPR Secretary Manny Flores also attended to give greetings.

The agenda (see attached) was amended slightly due to the afternoon keynote speaker's airline travel being disrupted by the FAA problems. Two ICN Board members adapted and delivered the RWJF presentation. Diversity issues were addressed by the RWJF consultant.

Participants were very enthusiastic about networking opportunities during the morning registration period and over lunch. The format of the lunch break with boxed lunches and separate smaller rooms with tables was planned to facilitate dialogue among participants. The facility size accommodated the group well. Even with the absence of microphones, the acoustics allowed those in the back of the room to hear.

While the format of having a keynote speaker and panel of reactors worked for this meeting, future meetings might be organized around a single topic. For example, the reaction to the comments made by the Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE) Executive Director might be expanded upon by educators from all levels of healthcare education and those involved in the Science Technology Education and Mathematics (STEM) initiative. The IBHE Executive Director could interview a speaker representing an innovative model for expanding educational opportunity and then open discussion with the educator participants. Another meeting might focus on ideas to address public health issues. Another might focus on payment and include speakers from insurance, Medicaid, and business. A format different than a full day meeting such as a series of lunch seminars with selected, invited participants might be considered.

Informal feedback indicates that participants reacted favorably to the information presented, found the material and networking useful, and would like to participate in future meetings of this type. Formal follow up communication with the participants is being planned. The IHAC Collaboration workgroup chair is designing a survey that is intended to provide a summative evaluation as well as solicit ideas for further collaboration. Partnership work should continue in tandem with the IHAC Collaboration workgroup.
