The program is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education.</p>
MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:	<p>The successful candidate will have a doctorate, preferably a Ph.D., EdD, or DNP in nursing science or a closely related area (applicants who are ABD will be considered), an M.S. in Nursing, and current Registered Nurse licensure.</p> <p>For one position, candidates should have an educational and experiential background in medical-surgical nursing and/or community health nursing. For this position, preference will be given to candidates who have expertise in the use of human patient simulation in nursing education.</p> <p>For the second position, candidates should have an educational and experiential background in medical-surgical nursing and/or community health nursing and/or maternal/child nursing. For this position, preference will be given to candidates who are Advanced Practice Nurses.</p> <p>Both positions will involve graduate and undergraduate teaching, which may include online course delivery and travel to off-campus locations, as well as research, university and professional service, and student advising. Relevant professional work experience is desirable.</p>
