 - A: Nurses per 102 Illinois counties: there are separate tables for the different types of nurses licensed in Illinois by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation (IDFPR): FPA-APRNs, APRNs, RNs and LPNs. Documents reviewed at length, including details of each column of data in the draft documents. Review and discuss separate county table for: LPNs, RNs and a combined APRN and FPA-APRN document.
 - -Summary: general board agreement to, as has been the past practice, place this information in the biennial data report for each level of licensure.
 - B: Age data for: Illinois LPNs, RNs, APRNs and, FPA-APRNs reviewed. October-November 2022 voluntary survey participation for Illinois RNs, APRNs and FPA-APRNs collected; data includes date of birth. June 2023: IDFPR Licensure database accessed for age data of all LPN, RN, APRN and FPA-APRN license applications. LPN age data voluntarily collected February-March 2023. Discuss variances for each level of licensure survey responses are generally older than the age of active licensees.

 - A. Review of Statute and Illinois Open Meetings Act

<u>Illinois Nurse Practice Act, Article #75</u>: The Illinois Nursing Workforce Center: Purpose: to address issues of supply and demand in the nursing profession,

including issues of recruitment, retention, and utilization of nurse manpower resources.

Objectives or primary goals of the Center: to develop a strategic plan for nursing manpower in Illinois by selecting priorities that must be addressed; to convene various groups of representatives to review and comment on data analysis; to recommend systemic changes including strategies for implementation of recommended changes; to enhance and promote recognition, reward and renewal activities. The Center will propose and create reward, recognition and renewal activities for nurses, promoting media and positive image-building efforts for nursing.

<u>Illinois Open Meetings Act</u>: including rules for conducting meetings, facilitating public access to board meetings. Access includes publicly posting the agenda in

advance of the meeting; participation: ask for public comment during each Board meeting. Meetings are to be in-person beginning May 11, 2023. members individually HB1615, 225 ILCS 65/75-10 Signed by the governor 7/28/23. Provides that the Illinois voted Nursing Workforce Center's primary goals shall include developing a strategic plan for approval for the nursing workforce in the State. - -National Council State Boards of Nursing Annual Meeting, August 2023. Multiple Board of Nursing members were able to attend. Presentations included WHO spokesperson in the healthcare workforce.
- -The Board of Nursing distributed the annual pre-licensure nursing education survey request to the 138 eligible pre-licensure nursing LPN and RN programs. Completion is required by the Illinois Nurse Practice Act (NPA), Section 1300.230 (LPN) / 1300.340 (RN). Program response due date is 10/1/2023.
- -HB2509 was signed by Governor Pritzker in August 11,2023, Public Act#103-0533. This bill goes into effect January 1, 2024.

Each seminar will be 90 minutes; resource docs will be sent either just prior to or shortly after webinar is completed.

- C. The RWJF/R. Hannon final grants: there were 6 final grants funded for FY22, and there are 2 grants that are in the process of completion in 2023.
