#### V. New Business

Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) data collection through eblasts.
 LPN license renewal began mid-November 2022 and ended 1/31/2023. Data from Illinois LPNs was collected from February 16 – March 22, 2023. Eblast messages with a link to a SurveyMonkey survey were distributed twice, 2/16/2023 and 3/03/23 to approximately 27,000 IL LPNs. The response rate was approximately 31%, 8,367 LPNs. A draft one-page "key findings" document was reviewed.

  - Legislation: Welcome IDFPR Attorney R. Breen: briefly discuss two pieces of legislation, HB1615 and HB2509. Questions asked and answered. For both pieces of legislation meetings with sponsor and interested parties continue.

Additional information below presented by L. B. Roberts on behalf IDFPR Nursing Coordinator:

- Board of Nursing pre-licensure RN & LPN annual pass rates for 2022 not yet posted on the IDFPR website. There are 3 categories of schools with less than standard pass rate: warning letter, probation, school closure. Schools receive pass rates throughout the year, on a quarterly basis;. Beginning with the Fall quarterly report schools also receive remediation guidelines that have been created by the Board of Nursing/BON.
- The IDFPR Temporary Practice Permits/TPP are due to expire 5/31/23. Since 3/20/20 IDFPR has issued TPP reinstatements and endorsements to certain healthcare professionals, including nurses. All TPP holders have received notification that if they are planning to continue to practice in Illinois they need to apply for either license reinstatement or endorsement. There is current legislation to extend the deadline for TPP recipients to complete the application process.
- o Illinois Nursing Workforce Center Manager Report
  - Transition of Nursing Education Scholarship Program/NESP administration from IDPH/Illinois Department of Public Health/IDPH to ISAC/Illinois Student Assistance Commission discussed during Announcements. NESP application deadline end of April.
  - IBHE/Illinois Board of Higher Education FY23 Nurse Educator Fellows and Nursing School grants:
    - The joint IDFPR/IBHE remote recognition ceremony will be at the beginning of the May

- General discussion regarding the March 15 IBHE board meeting motions regarding Nurse Educator Fellows and Nursing School grant amendments. Concern was expressed about the proposed amendments.
- National Forum State Nursing Workforce Centers next annual meeting will be in-person only in Arlington Virginia, June 12-14, 2023.
- Outreach: various activities since the last INWC board meeting described. Future events include Student Nurse Day, April 18, 2023, Springfield, Illinois.
- Other: preparing for State of Illinois in-person board meetings. The first INWC BOD in-person meeting will be Wednesday September 13, 11am-1pm. All State of Illinois boards must begin in-person meetings on May 11, 2023. Review use of IDFPR videoconference rooms in Chicago and Springfield, required State of Illinois ID badges, use of expense voucher to reimburse travel expenses such as mileage and parking, etc. Additional in-person meeting details during board meeting next month.
- Other: Illinois Department Health and Family Services/HFS: initial contact was answering questions regarding Illinois nursing faculty, the various pre and post licensure education programs. This multi-year project has a focus on the healthcare workforce, various licensed professions. Continue communication and anticipate future meetings.

### Chairperson Report:

- Robert Wood Johnson Foundation/RWJF Center to Champion Nursing in America: There is tentatively a remote meeting scheduled for Monday June 19.
- Webinars focusing on Illinois graduate nursing education programs preparing nursing faculty was discussed under Announcements. Are you a nurse wanting to educate future nurses? Next webinar Wednesday April 19, 2023. Webinars are also taped and available on IDFPR YouTube upon completion.
- NCLEX® NextGen/NGN style questions. The nurse initial licensure examination, NCLEX®, has started (4/1/23) including as a portion of the examination NGN style questions. Arrangements have been made to have NCSBN/National Council State Boards of Nursing to present education sessions about this new style of questions to Illinois nursing faculty. The plan is to have one webinar directed towards faculty teaching LPN students and one towards faculty teaching RN students. When the webinar dates are finalized details for registration will be shared with Illinois nursing faculty.
- The RWJF Public Health Nurse Leaders/PHNL grants: the INF is collecting the end of grant reports. All grant funds were distributed in December 2022. There were six grants distributed, multiple reports continue to be collected.
